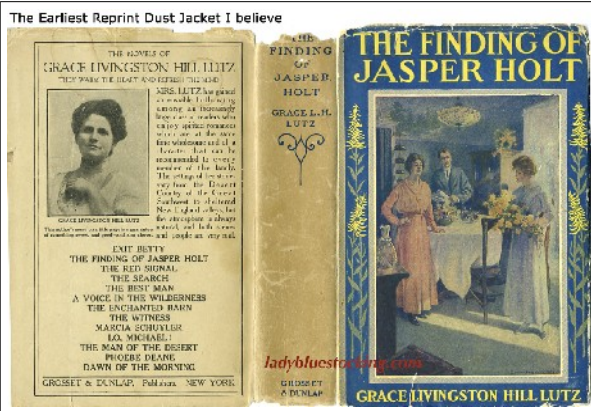


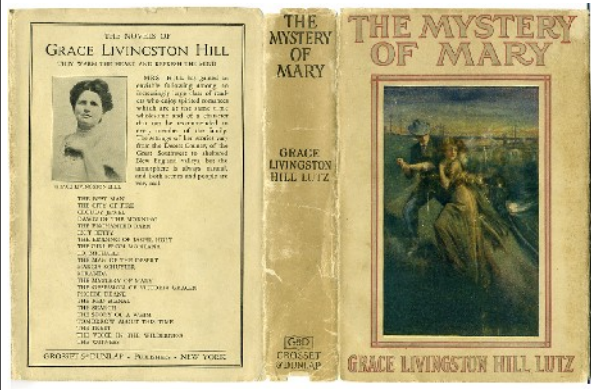
Grace Livingston Hill Dust Jacket Dates

Reprint books are often misleading as far as dates are concerned. The book you are holding in your hand may have been printed much later than the most recent date mentioned. What appears on the rear of the dust jacket can offer clues as to when the book was actually printed. Below is a little work I did in my attempts to determine the actual age of the GLH books in my own collection.



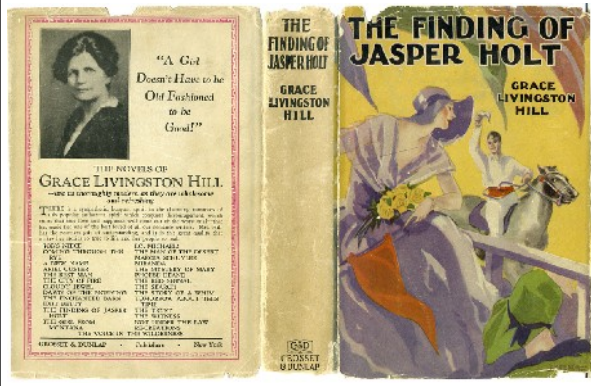
**Lists 13 Titles. None later than 1920
Can't be older than 1920**

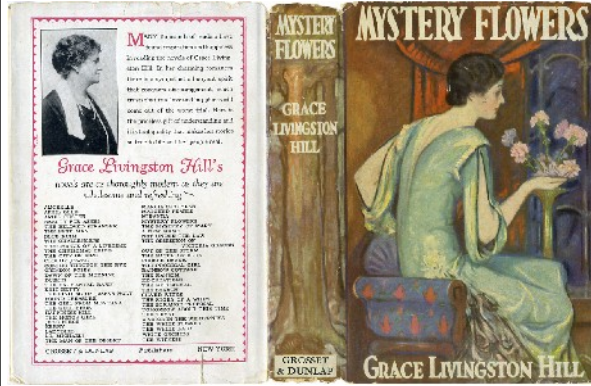
**Lists 22 Titles. None later than 1924,
Can't be older than 1924**

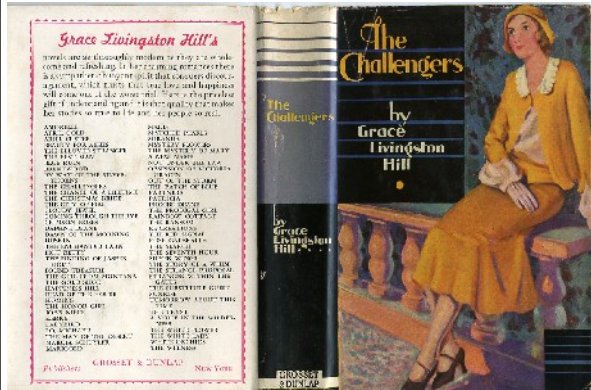
**Lists 28 Titles. None later than 1927
Can't be older than 1927**

Can't be older than 1936**

Wartime: Circa 1943 I believe.

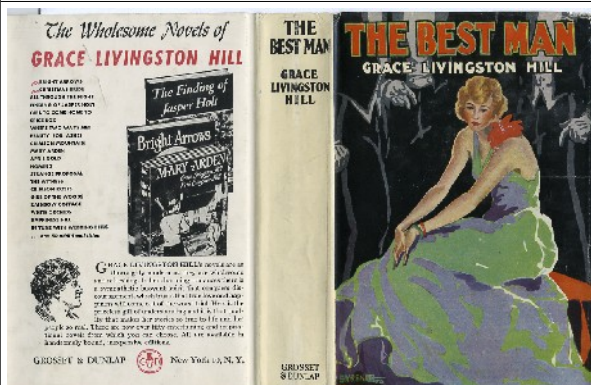
Explanation of need to conserve and recycle paper for wartime uses on the rear of the dust jacket.
